Subject: RE: Poggemeyer

Jack,

The Village Offices were closed on Tuesday for Veteran's Day and I did not see your email until this morning.

On Tuesday, May 6, I received a phone call from Township Trustee Bill Habig advising me that Owens Corning (through Poggemeyer Design Group) was preparing an application for the Ohio Job Ready Sites grant program to assist in the development of the Owens Corning site as an office-research park. Bill asked that the Village prepare a letter indicating (1) whether the Village would be willing to continue to supply water to the site that would be a more intensely developed office park; and (2) whether the Village would be willing to supply sewer service to the site. Bill indicated that the letter needed to be prepared by Friday, May 9. Bill mentioned that Southwest Licking was also being asked about its ability to serve the site with utilities.

On the evening of May 6, Mayor Hartfield and I received an email from Township Trustee Wes Sargent requesting a letter of support for the Owens Corning application that would help Owens acquire up to \$5 million from the Ohio Job Ready Sites program to help develop the Granville Science and Technology Complex.

We prepared a letter that expressed the Village's support of the application by Owens Corning for grant funds to assist with the development of the Granville Science and Technology Complex; and also indicated that the Village would be willing to supply water and sewer to the complex. That letter was emailed to Mike Sachs at Poggemeyer on Friday, May 9 in accordance with the instructions provided by the Trustees.

I had no conversations with Poggemeyer about the grant application and was unaware that the application would indicate that Southwest Licking would be the primary sewer provider. At the time of my discussions with the Trustees, it was my understanding that the grant application was still being finalized.
